Never squeeze by or get between a turning vehicle and the curb.

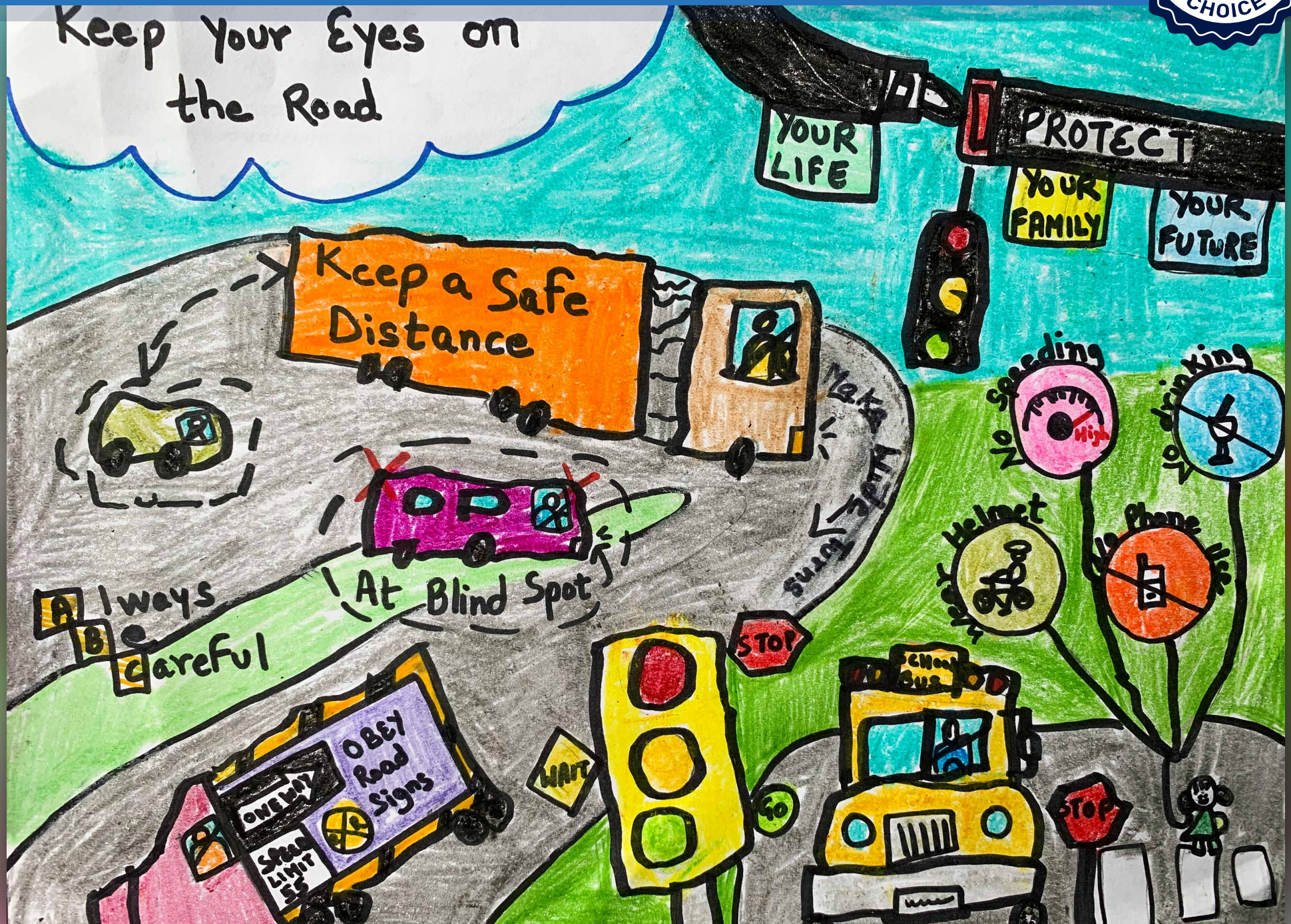

Large vehicles have huge blind spots on all four sides. Avoid lingering in these areas to stay most visible.

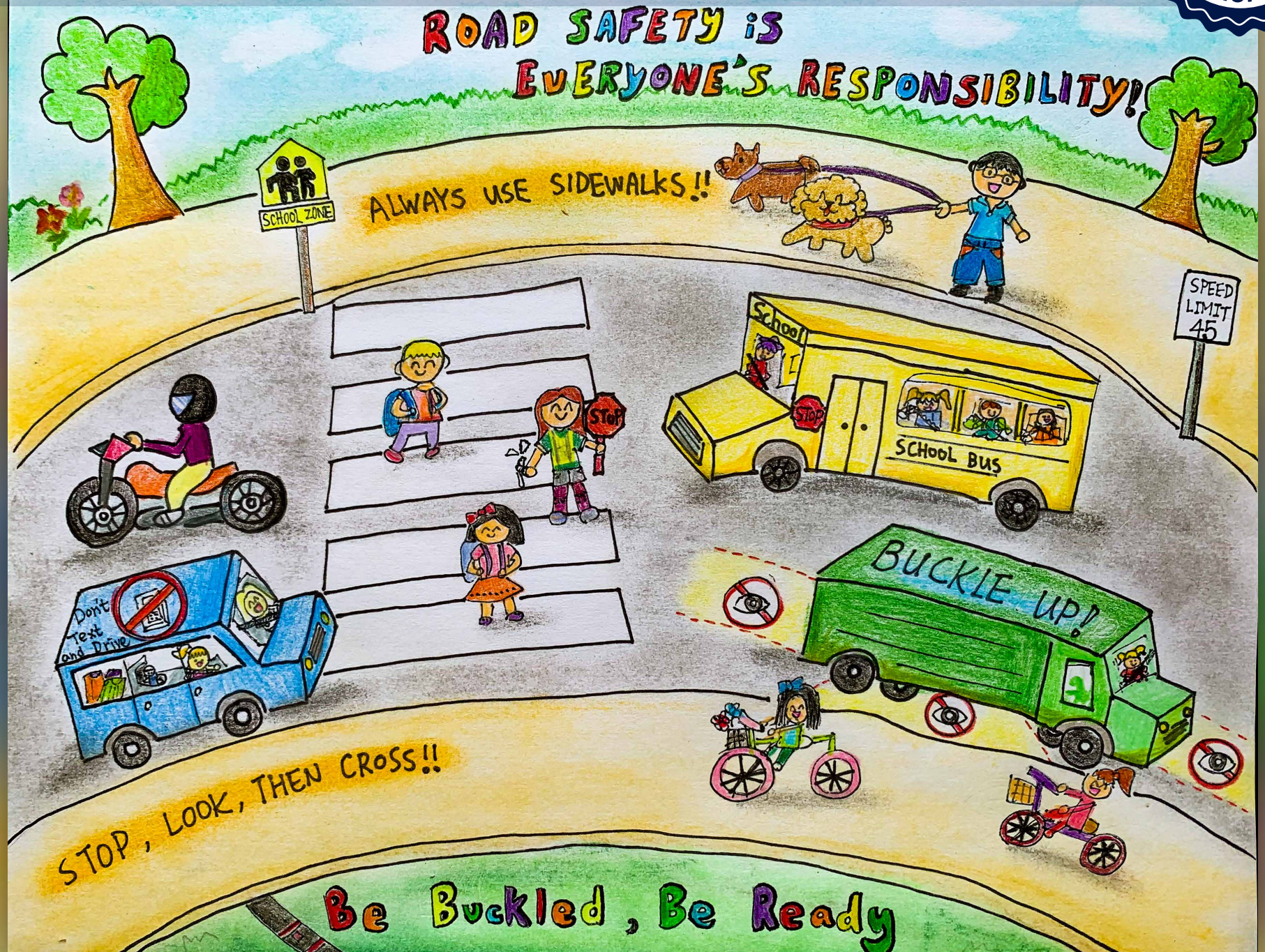
