1 intersection crash involving a large truck every 2 hours and 54 minutes 1 person killed in a crash involving a large truck every 1 day, 21 hours, and 30 minutes

Follow these tips from the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration's *Our Roads, Our Safety* campaign:



Avoid Blind Spots

Large trucks and buses have enormous blind spots on all four sides. It's important to stay out of blind spots.



Be Aware of Wide Turns

Large trucks and buses make wide turns. The best place to be when they are turning is either in front or behind, not beside them.



Understand Long Stopping Distances

Large trucks and buses are heavy and need the length of up to two football fields to stop. Avoid cutting closely in front of a truck or bus.



Avoid Driving Distracted

Everyone on the road should obey all traffic laws, and always stay focused. Driving distracted is as dangerous as driving impaired.
