Initiative Overview

Our Roads, Our Safety Summary

Our Roads, Our Safety is a national safety campaign led by the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) to raise awareness about sharing the road safely with all road users, especially large trucks and buses. The *Our Roads, Our Safety* campaign supports FMCSA's mission of reducing crashes, injuries, and fatalities involving large trucks and buses. As part of this effort, FMCSA partners with other organizations to educate all drivers, cyclists, and pedestrians on the importance of sharing the road.

As part of these efforts, FMCSA also provides resources to educate and reinforce safe driving behaviors with all drivers, and in particular, those driving around large trucks and buses. This playbook contains messages and materials to encourage drivers to not drive distracted.

Publishing Strategy

Encouraging the public to not drive distracted can be flowed into your content strategy at any point in the year. We also recommend utilizing this content around times when more drivers are on the roads, such as summer, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, and winter holidays.

When publishing this content, we encourage you to use **#OurRoads** with your posts to help engage in the larger *Our Roads, Our Safety* conversation.

- Distracted driving is dangerous. Stay focused on **#OurRoads** when behind the wheel.
- Any activity besides driving carefully can cause you to become distracted. This includes using your phone, eating, drinking, and interacting with your GPS. Stay focused on #OurRoads.
- It is critical to stay focused behind the wheel of your CMV to help keep yourself and others safe on #OurRoads. Don't drive distracted.

- If you need to eat while on the road, pull over and take a break to do so. Eating and drinking can take your focus off the road. Don't drive distracted. **#OurRoads**
- Eating behind the wheel causes distraction and puts your safety and others at risk. Stay focused and don't drive distracted. **#OurRoads**

- Set your GPS when you first get in your truck or bus to avoid unnecessary distractions while driving. Don't drive distracted. **#OurRoads**
- Pull over to adjust your GPS if you need to change your destination or route. Stay focused on the road.
