REMARKS AND COMMITTEE ACTION

Larry Minor, Associate Administrator for Policy, FMCSA and DFO, welcomed the TLTF committee members with Shannon Watson, Deputy DFO, and Kala Wright, Director of External Affairs. Committee members introduced themselves.

Greetings from U.S. Secretary of Transportation Pete Buttigieg

Secretary Buttigieg welcomed the members, recognizing the importance of the trucking industry and making sure everyone who enters the career is treated fairly. The Secretary acknowledged the importance of TLTF in informing policy decisions though the expertise and life experience that each member brings to the committee. He stated that policymakers will turn to TLTF to examine and advise on the terms and conditions of truck leasing arrangements and their impact on drivers and trucking businesses.

A Visit with FMCSA Administrator Robin Hutcheson

Administrator Hutcheson noted that truck leasing is a priority because the conditions that surround the work and environment for truck drivers are a root cause for safety. The Administrator referenced existing data that suggests the longer a driver's experience the safer the driving. She thanked TLTF members for offering expert insights into unfair lease agreements per the requirements of the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law.

Mr. Miller conducted annual ethics training for TLTF members, who serve as Representative and Special Government employee members under the Federal Advisory Committee Act.

Task Statement 23-1: Information and Data Needs for Examining the Terms, Conditions, and Equitability of Common Truck Leasing Arrangements

TLTF deliberated on Task 23-1, requesting a report to the Agency regarding TLTF's examination of the terms, conditions, and equitability of common truck leasing arrangements, particularly as they impact owner-operators and trucking businesses subject to such agreements. This task focuses primarily on information and data TLTF believes it needs to support its work as it plans its meeting schedule.

Discussion Points

- Language used in the discussion lease programs should differentiate between lease purchase agreements and owner-operator lease agreements.
- Important to understand the bad actors in the truck leasing programs and how they undermine trucking industry confidence in the reputable truck leasing programs for drivers.
- Important to understand the firsthand experiences of drivers who have been part of predatory leasing programs.
- Recognize the control carriers in a lease purchase agreement have over drivers.
- Industry experience is important when entering truck leasing programs for the driver and for trucking businesses. It is important to understand why trucking companies enter into these agreements.
- Education for new entrants into the industry as well as experienced drivers can help drivers better understand the risks and signs of potential predatory leasing scenarios.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

- Michelle Kitchin, Driver and RWIT Board member, reiterated the human impact of predatory leasing in the trucking industry. She described being at truck stops and seeing the effects of such agreements on drivers. Some drivers are not making the money they thought they were promised. Ms. Kitchin noted that this can impact sleep and nutrition.
- Desiree Wood, Founder and President, RWIT, and a truck driver, mentioned the need for more transparency in the lease purchase process and that students can be led into these agreements when they have little industry experience. She recommends that FMCSA look further into its National Consumer Complaint Database, as drivers report into this database.
- Renee Williams, 1WAY Transport, feels that the biggest take-away from the discussion is to know and understand your lease. She hopes the committee will address this important issue.
- Gareth Jones, Owner-Operator, Washington, DC, shared that he and his wife entered a predatory lease and understand the need for more help to get out from such leases. Mr. Jones thanked the committee for trying to bring back respect for the industry and for drivers.
