

FMCSA Grant Application Process

The Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) provides several financial assistance opportunities, through five [discretionary grant programs](#), to support activities and projects that enhance motor carrier safety and/or advance innovative transportation technology. Interested parties must apply and compete for funding.

STEP 1

Visit [Grants.gov](#)

The site includes all the information you need to prepare, apply for, and track grants.

- Equip yourself with information and materials you need at the Grants Learning Center: [grants.gov/learn-grants](#).

STEP 2

View Notice of Funding Opportunities (NOFOs)

FMCSA posts all available grants on [Grants.gov](#) as NOFOs.

- [Subscribe](#) to FMCSA grant announcements through Grants.gov.

Use the [Search Grants](#) function to view NOFOs.

- Type “FMCSA” in the Keyword(s) box.
- To view grants available to Minority Institutions of Higher Education (MIHEs), select “Private Institutions of Higher Education” and/or “Public and State Institutions of Higher Education” under the “Eligibility” criteria.

STEP 3

Complete Registration Steps

Takes several weeks to complete. Approval times vary.

1. All applicants must register with [SAM.gov](#).
2. All Applicants must register on [Grants.gov](#) through [Workspace](#) to apply to NOFOs.

Complete these steps early to avoid missing an application deadline.

STEP 4

Complete the Application

Application submission deadlines are published in the NOFO.

Complete the application through your [Workspace](#) account.

- Check out the [Grants.gov blog](#) for application tips.
- Save your application often while it’s in progress.
- Ensure all required documents listed in the NOFO are uploaded successfully in [grants.gov](#) including project and budget narratives.

Make sure to compare your organization’s capabilities with the eligibility and technical requirements.

STEP 5

Await Award Decision

Announced by September 30. Track your application submission at Grants.gov.

- All applications are reviewed by FMCSA for statutory and regulatory compliance, programmatic value, financial soundness, and potential for success.

Application Review

FMCSA typically conducts the following application review steps:

1. Initial screening to ensure application is complete and eligible
2. Programmatic review and assessment of the application substance
3. Financial review of proposed budgets
