REMARKS AND COMMITTEE ACTION

Shannon Watson, DFO, Kala Wright, Director of External Affairs, and Joyce Brenny, WOTAB Chair, welcomed everyone. Ms. Watson introduced FMCSA Deputy Administrator Earl Adams, who provided remarks. WOTAB members then introduced themselves.

Members approved the June 29, 2023, meeting minutes unanimously.

PIONEERING WOMEN IN TRUCKING

Elisabeth Barna, Principal/Founder, EAB Strategies, LLC, shared her personal career story and vision for how trucking can become a more attractive and practical career for women. Ms. Barna described how her principles guided her journey toward her career goals and recommended best practices for women in the industry.

Presentation: Demographics of the CMV Workforce

Kimberly Lambert, Chief, Strategic Planning and Program Evaluation Division, FMCSA During previous meetings, WOTAB asked for demographic information of CDL holders. Ms. Lambert presented summary statistics of drivers using data sources including the commercial driver's license information systems (CDLIS) and Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS). Summary findings comparing CDL holders to the overall U.S. labor force focusing on included age, sex, marital status, disability, veteran status, immigrants, and limited English proficiency. WOTAB members identified data gaps in these populations and recommended inclusion of Trans drivers, women, or minority-owned companies and related data as well as the potential use of clearinghouse data to support more granular and reliable details to include in this dataset.

Begin consideration of Task 23-3, Opportunities to Enhance Trucking Training, Mentorship, Education, and Advancement and Outreach Programs To Increase the Number of Women in the CMV Industry

WOTAB deliberated on Task 23-3, in which FMCSA requests WOTAB to provide feedback to the Agency regarding opportunities that enhance commercial motor vehicle (CMV) driver training, mentorship, education, and advancement and outreach programs that would increase the number of women in the CMV industry.

Women of Trucking Advisory Board

Discussion Points

- WOTAB discussed the need to focus on women drivers already in the industry and not only recruitment into the industry.
- WOTAB discussed underserved populations that could benefit from an introduction to trucking. These groups include indigenous communities, veterans, and prisons.
- WOTAB discussed training in terms of standardization while keeping up with changes in technology. In addition to opportunities for apprenticeship and support from established women organizations within and outside of the trucking industry.

Discussion: Options for Preparing WOTAB Final Report

Chair Brenny and Shannon Watson reviewed how the WOTAB final report will be prepared, organized as each meeting presented as a different chapter. Chair Brenny chose members of WOTAB to create a subcommittee with the purpose of compiling information for the meetings and creating a final draft for all WOTAB members to review at future meetings. Subcommittee members include Joyce Sauer Brenny, Dianne McNair-Smith, Kellylynn McLaughlin, Sharae Moore, Soledad Munoz Smith, and Nicole Ward.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Lindsay Trent president and co-founder of Next Gen Trucking Association expressed how much she appreciated being able to listen to the meeting, acknowledging the incredible things WOTAB is doing. Next Gen Trucking assists in bringing young people from rural and urban areas into high skill trucking jobs. It is not just filling out a job application but also talking with school counselors, to change their mindset in considering trucking as an industry where women can succeed. Providing tools for others to create touch-a-truck events and encourage carriers to host and give flyers out at the event that talk about women and their success in the industry. Trucking is a career, and each person and carrier has a voice in the trucking community.

Michelle Kitchin of Real Women in Trucking has been driving accident-free since 1988 and would like to see public service announcements (PSA) to recruit more women. She asks if it is responsible to refrain from acknowledging problems with safety, lack of well-lit parking, harassment, and abuse. She questions whether it is fair only to tell them the good part of the career without mentioning the potential hazards. Not knowing can provide misinformation and create problems with little evidence that attempts has been made to make changes for the better.

Ingrid Brown of Rollin' B LLC expressed her gratitude for each board member and looks forward to WOTAB's work coming to fruition.

Narria Rice, Owner of Transenergy CDL Academy, an approved Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) vendor with high recruitment, acknowledged that there is a challenge in getting CDL training especially when funding is not available. Giving potential drivers the names of companies who may be able to sponsor them could be helpful in keeping them moving into the industry. Career centers could also serve as a potential resource to complete applications.

Stephani Clevenger-Murphy of the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio works with new entrant audits and with new carriers who ask what they should do to recruit new drivers. Ms. Clevenger-Murphy hears from drivers who are looking for jobs and carriers that are looking for drivers but cannot connect them. Were auditors to give carriers and drivers a space where they can list information for the others, connections would be easier to make. It is important for new drivers to know that consultants can take advantage of them.
