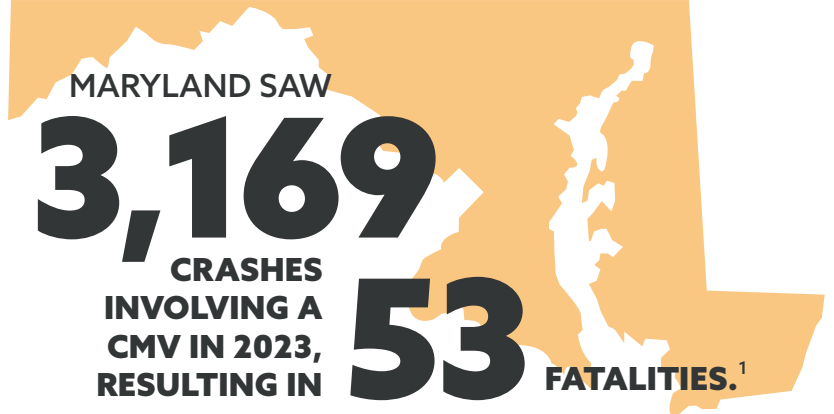

- **Montgomery County:** I-270, I-495, **Connecticut Avenue**, Carroll Avenue, **New Hampshire Avenue**, **Georgia Avenue**, **University Boulevard**, and Rockville Pike
- **Prince George's County:** I-495, Powder Mill Road, Croom Road, **Baltimore Avenue**, Rhode Island Avenue, University Boulevard, Carroll Avenue, **Kenilworth Avenue**, Woodyard Road, Riverdale Road, **St. Barnabas Road**, **Branch Avenue**, **MLK Highway**, and Main Street
- **Anne Arundel County:** I-695, I-97, **Annapolis Road**, Central Avenue, Muddy Creek Road, Arundel Expressway, Paul Pitcher Highway, Aviation Boulevard, St. Margarets Road, **Governor Ritchie Highway**, Maples Road, Fairhaven Road, and **Blue Star Highway**
