REMARKS AND COMMITTEE ACTION

Larry Minor, DFO, welcomed TLTF members with Shannon Watson, Deputy DFO. Committee members introduced themselves and Steve Rush, TLTF Chair, gave opening remarks reminding the committee that its role is to find ways to stop predatory practices in the commercial motor vehicle (CMV) industry. Members approved unanimously the March 21, 2024, meeting minutes.

Presentation: Consumer Financial Protection Bureau (CFPB)

Emma Oppenheim and Ryan Kelly of CFPB provided an update on the leases gathered via FMCSA's Request for Information: Drivers' Leasing Agreements for CMVs. CFPB will present more detailed information about the leasing agreements at the July 18th meeting.

Establishment of Subcommittee

The chair announced the subcommittee to review the publicly available case documents on leasing, appointed Kaitlyn Long as chair, and named Paul Cullen, Lesley Tse, and Dr. Steve Viscelli as members. The subcommittee will begin its deliberations prior to the July 18 meeting and will present its findings to TLTF for its consideration at a subsequent meeting.

Task 24-3: Whether truck leasing agreements properly incentivize the safe operation of vehicles, including driver compliance with the hours-of-service regulations and laws governing speed and safety generally, and identify resources to assist CMV drivers in assessing the financial impacts of leasing agreements

Members deliberated on Task 24-3, where FMCSA asks the committee to review and discuss whether truck leasing agreements properly incentivize the safe operation of vehicles, including



driver compliance with the hours-of-service regulations and laws governing speed and safety generally, and identify resources to assist CMV drivers in assessing the financial impacts of such agreements.

Discussion Points

- The financial and personal risks that lease purchase agreements pose to drivers.
- Warning signs that a lease may be a predatory lease.
- Possible benefits of a two-check driver compensation system.
- The viability of curtailing lease purchase agreements.
- Resources to educate drivers on lease purchase agreements.
- Why drivers enter into lease purchase agreements.
- The high failure rate of lease purchase agreements.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Aretha Moodie, consumer/trucker, tried to obtain her own truck through a lease/purchase company that required her to be running for a year. Ms. Moodie stated that situations of debt, bankruptcy, and excessive hours of operation all need to change.

Billy Randel, consumer/trucker, stated that carriers will not improve their leasing practices since no one has required them to do so. Truckers organize to no avail. He stated that there are predatory lease programs targeted to inner city men and women of color, immigrants, and poor rural people with limited economic opportunity.

Jay Grimes, Director OOIDA, has seen red flags for years, with drivers having little chance of ever owning a truck, zero independence, high turnover, safety risks, and the pressures of escalating debt creating highway safety risks. Drivers should have access to education and resources to learn more about financing and contract agreements. Mr. Grimes looks forward to CFPB's report next month and the Task Force's final report later this year to take substantive actions to protect drivers from predatory practices.

William McKelvie, independent trucker, noted that there should be clear definitions of independent contractor, owner/operator, etc. If this issue is addressed it will help with pay issues, etc. With a lease/purchase, the lessor is responsible for the lessee. They should sit down with those people, explain the contract and answer questions. Two companies do this, Landstar (done with every new beneficial cargo owner) and Mercer (whole orientation class).

Jaelan Wine, owner/operator, noted that the purchase price of trucks is too high. Companies cheat drivers by slowing down their work while still charting payment. Ms. Wine recommends creating a portal for reviews for keeping track of how companies are treating their lessees.

Richard Malchow, industry/business advisor for J.J. Keller, advises customers on leasing regulations. Mr. Malchow suggests that TLTF review household goods regulations. Recommendations to Congress should reference existing rules. He suggests further that drivers should have 3-day right of recission for leases.
