The driver shall certify to the correctness of all entries by signing the form containing the driver's duty status record with his/her legal name or name of record. The driver's signature certifies that all entries required by this section made by the driver are true and correct. Time base to be used. The driver's duty status record shall be prepared, maintained, and submitted using the time standard in effect at the driver's home terminal, for a 24-hour period beginning with the time specified by the motor carrier for that driver's home terminal. The term 7 or 8 consecutive days means the 7 or 8 consecutive 24-hour periods as designated by the carrier for the driver's home terminal. Shipping document number(s), or name of shipper and commodity shall be shown on the driver's record of duty status.

12. Maintain completed inspection form for 12 months from the date of inspection at the carrier's principal place of business.

The driver of any motor vehicle receiving an inspection report shall deliver it to the motor carrier operating the vehicle upon his/her arrival at the next terminal or facility. If the driver is not scheduled to arrive at a terminal or facility of the motor carrier operating the vehicle within 24 hours, the driver shall immediately mail the report to the motor carrier.

CR was conducted for the reason that FMCSA must conduct a compliance review on a Mexico-domiciled carrier within 18 months after the FMCSA issues the carrier provisional operating authority under part 365.

Compliance review was conducted at the FMCSA border office at 2297 Niels Bohr Court Suite 204, San Diego, CA. 92154. This Motor carrier has no history of Compliance Reviews, but has received a PASS result in a Pre Authorization Safety Audit on 08/21/2007.

Opening interview and CR process was conducted with Moises Alvarez Perez, owner of Distribuidora Marina El Pescador, which he handles day to day operations and transportation paperwork for this company.

Distribuidora Marina El Pescador is both a private and for-hire carrier of general freight. Company started interstate operations in 1999, but received operating authority as a private carrier on 02/12/2007 to operate between points in California. In 02/15/2008 carrier received provisional authority as a private and for-hire carrier, under the Border Demonstration Program.

Carrier transports frozen seafood from Los Angeles, CA. to Tijuana BN, Mexico, he then distributes the cargo to Mexico City, and Monterey City, Mexico. Carrier's main suppliers are Glacier Cold Storage, Showa storage, and customers in Mexico are: The Mazateño and several other fish markets. Carrier claims business is slow, but inventory has been purchased in larger quantities exceeding the size of his straight truck. He claims this helps to lower the costs of transportation. He is contracting a carrier (Premier Logistics Center) to transport his cargo using a tractor trailer.

Carrier's parent company is Alva Trading, an import/export company with no commercial vehicles assigned, located in San Diego, California. Mr. Moises Alvarez Perez is also owner of the parent company. Carrier uses a storage/satellite office located in Calle Aquiles Cerdan Y Calle Quience #1179-9, Colonia Libertad parte baja, Tijuana BN, Mexico. An update to carrier's PPOB in Mexico has been annotated and updated in MCMIS.

Carrier employed one driver in the last 365 days and ^{b6, b7c} straight truck, with a GVWR over 26,001 Lbs.

Safety Management operations were investigated with the following parts: Sample sizes were based on eFOTM requirements.

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Part C

Part 40/ Part 382 - Carrier showed evidence of controlled substance and alcohol testing program, enrolled with RMC Testing Solutions. Verified enrollment with Cindy Cunningham, (619) 661-0572. She explained consortium met the 50% testing rate for controlled substances and met the 10% testing rate for alcohol, for 2008 calendar year. There were 1,998 drivers in a large pool, of which 1,005 were tested for controlled substance and 258 tested for alcohol for calendar year 2008. Current driver in this company tested negative.

Violations discovered and noted: carrier failed to have statistical summaries for 2008 random testing, and failed to conduct supervisor training. Carrier was made aware of the severity of having this program improved. He claimed it will be improved once the review is complete.

Part 383 - After reviewing the profile, CDLIS check was conducted on driver shown on the profile. Current driver is he has been driving for this company for the . Carrier used the same driver within the last 365 days. No problems noted.

Part 387 - Carrier showed an MCS-90 and was verified with Commercial Alliance Insurance Company policy # CEC025483, also verified with L&I website. No problems noted.

Part 390 - Motor carrier had zero recordable accident in the past 365 days.

Part 391- After reviewing the profile, the driver shown on the profile was selected for review. Reviewed one driver file per eFOTM sample size.

Violations discovered and noted: carrier failed to furnish a list of traffic violations each 12 months. Carrier was informed the significance in having a driver qualification file in order to gain compliance in this part.

Part 393- Vehicle was not inspected during this review, due to the unavailability during the CR. The OOS rate was calculated using the carrier profile, 0 vehicle OOS of 3 inspections at 0%.

Part 395 - After reviewing the profile, driver shown on the profile was selected for review. Carrier operates beyond the 100 air-mile-radius and is required to complete RODS. Reviewed 30 RODS since only one driver was subject to this part.

Violations were discovered and noted: failed to make RODS in the form and manner prescribed, driver did not add commodity or shipper number, mileage, and company address. Carrier was advised of the significance in having RODS reviewed and completed in the correct manner.

Part 396- After reviewing the profile, vehicle shown on the profile was selected for review. Verified unit placed OOS on the carrier profile was not operated until defects and deficiencies were corrected. After interviewing the carrier, it was discovered company uses an outside independent vendor to conduct periodic maintenance on company vehicles. Inspections have been mainly conducted by state or federal officials at inspection facilities. Since carrier only operates one CMV, he is using 396.11 exemption for DVIRS.

Violations as noted: carrier failed to maintain roadside inspections on file, and failed to identify vehicle's tire-size. Carrier was informed to make necessary changes and updates to maintenance and inspection files.

For the conclusion of the investigation owner, Moises Alvarez Perez was given a detailed explanation in the violations in part B and the importance of practicing Safety Management on all the parts of the FMCSRS.

This Compliance Review was performed by Safety Investigator Aaron Celiceo at the FMCSA Otay Mesa Border office in San Diego, California. A business card was attached to the copy of CR provided to the carrier.
