Dear Mr. Chairman:

I am pleased to provide written notification concerning the status of statutorily mandated rulemakings, as required under section 5307 of the Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act (Public Law 114-94).

The Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) has worked diligently to complete all statutorily required rulemakings, implementing 30 of the 43 sections of the Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act (MAP-21) that required rulemaking. In addition, FMCSA initiated regulatory action through advance notices of proposed rulemaking and a negotiated rulemaking for cases in which insufficient data or information was available to support the immediate issuance of a notice of proposed rulemaking. These actions are consistent with section 5202 of the FAST Act.

The FMCSA has placed the highest priority on completing and implementing statutorily mandated rulemakings likely to provide the greatest safety benefit and has committed the necessary resources to these activities. For example, since the enactment of MAP-21, FMCSA:

- implemented the National Registry of Certified Medical Examiners, with more than 46,000 certified private-sector healthcare professionals currently issuing medical certificates for truck and bus drivers;
- published the final rule concerning the mandatory use of electronic logging devices to monitor drivers' hours of service and hours-of-service supporting documents;
- published the final rule prohibiting motor carriers, freight forwarders, brokers, and shippers from coercing drivers to violate Federal safety regulations;
- published the final rule implementing the Unified Registration System to enhance the Agency's ability to identify all the entities subject to its safety oversight;
- issued the notice of proposed rulemaking to establish a controlled substances and alcohol
 testing results clearinghouse, with the final rule currently under departmental review; and
- published the notice of proposed rulemaking concerning entry-level driver training, based on a negotiated rulemaking committee's consensus on the best approach for addressing the MAP-21 requirements.

To further improve the rulemaking process, FMCSA has placed significant emphasis on conducting listening sessions to provide stakeholders an opportunity to share their views on certain statutorily mandated regulations before issuing a rulemaking notice. This public engagement approach assists the Agency in crafting regulatory language that effectively addresses safety challenges while keeping to a minimum the regulatory burden on the States and the private sector. The FMCSA has conducted listening sessions concerning the MAP-21 training provision for new entrant carriers, freight forwarders, and brokers. It has also conducted listening sessions concerning the provision to require States to implement annual inspection programs for passenger-carrying commercial motor vehicles and will continue to use public engagement as a method to improve the rulemaking process.

I have enclosed a chart that provides information for each of the rulemakings subject to the section 5307 requirement, including a description of actions taken to date, explanations for delays, and expected date of rulemaking completion.

I have sent a similar letter to the Ranking Member of the Senate Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation; the Chairman and Ranking Member of the Senate Subcommittee on Surface Transportation and Merchant Marine Infrastructure, Safety, and Security; the Chairman and Ranking Member of the House Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure; and the Chairman and Ranking Member of the House Subcommittee on Highways and Transit.
