The Drug interdiction Assistance Program - *DIAP* is a specialized unit of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration established in 1988. The program was established to assist law enforcement officials in the detection and apprehension of transporters and/or users of illicit drugs involving a Commercial Motor Vehicle. The focus of the program is on the development and distribution of criminal interdiction techniques to rapidly identify in-transit Commercial Vehicles and drivers engaged in criminal activity.

Since inception, members of the *DIAP* team have trained over 170,000 federal, state, and local officials in Commercial Vehicle drug and criminal interdiction tactics and techniques. Illicit drug seizures, impaired driver arrests, and criminal apprehensions routinely increase substantially after *DIAP* training.

Purpose	 To familiarize Officials who deal with Commercial Vehicle drivers with: indicators of deceptive behavior non-verbal communication Introduction to Neuro-linguistics verbal and non-verbal attributes cognitive interview spontaneous interview techniques Target Selection through familiarization of indicators of deception by a driver using, possessing or hauling illicit drugs, or engaged in other criminal activity, in a Commercial Vehicle.
Results	 Individual target selection skills will be enhanced and Officials making selections of CMV's for secondary inspection or further investigation will be more aware of indicators of human deception. Individual Interview skills will be enhanced. Larger numbers of CMV Drivers who are impaired or engaged in ongoing in-transit criminal activity will be identified and removed from our nation's highways, thereby reducing crashes.

Agreement with Respect to the Use and Distribution of DIAP CMVCI Student Handouts

This Agreement is entered into by, representing, the agency host of Drug Interdiction Assistance Program Commercial Vehicle Criminal Interdiction (CMVCI) training (hereinafter "Host") and the Drug Interdiction Assistance Program
(hereinafter "DIAP") effective as of the date of execution by both parties.
1. PURPOSE OF AGREEMENT . For a limited time ending on, the parties agree that it is desirable that the Host take possession DIAP CMVCI Student Handouts (defined below) for use in the conduct of DIAP Commercial Vehicle Criminal Interdiction (CMVCI) training.
2. DIAP CMVCI STUDENT HANDOUTS . "DIAP CMVCI Student Handouts" means information consistent with the purpose stated in Paragraph 1 which is disclosed in any tangible form and is clearly labeled or marked as DIAP CMVCI Student Handouts.
3. USE AND HANDLING OF DIAP CMVCI STUDENT HANDOUTS . From the effective date hereof, the Host may use DIAP CMVCI Student Handouts received from DIAP. The Host receiving DIAP CMVCI Student Handouts shall restrict their use to the purpose set forth in Paragraph 1 and shall safeguard them against disclosure to third parties using the same degree of care to prevent disclosure as it uses to protect its own information of like importance, but at least reasonable care. The Host may make only the minimum number of copies of any DIAP CMVCI Student Handout required to carry out the purpose of this Agreement. All proprietary and copyright notices in the original must be affixed to copies or partial copies.
4. LIMITATIONS ON THE OBLIGATION WITH RESPECT TO DIAP CMVCI STUDENT HANDOUTS . The Host shall not be obligated to maintain any information in confidence or refrain from use if:
a. The information was in the receiving Host's possession or was known to it prior to its receipt from the disclosing party;
b. The information is independently developed by the Host without the utilization of DIAP CMVCI Student Handouts;
c. The information is or becomes public knowledge without fault of the Host.
d. The information becomes available on an unrestricted basis to a third party from the DIAP or from someone acting
under its control; or
e. The information is publicly disclosed (i.e., not under adequate protective order) by DIAP under an order of a court or
government agency, provided that the Host provides prior written notification to DIAP of such obligation and the
opportunity to oppose such order.

- f. Ordered to release by a court of competent jurisdiction or otherwise required to release by law.
- 5. **INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS**. No rights or obligations other than these expressly recited herein are to be implied from this agreement. No license is hereby granted, directly or indirectly, under any patent, trade secret, copyright, mask work right or other intellectual property right now held by, or which may be obtained by, or which are or may be licensable by DIAP.
- 6. **ASSIGNMENT**. The Host may not assign any of its rights or obligations under this agreement without the prior written consent of DIAP.
- 7. **RETURN OF DIAP CMVCI STUDENT HANDOUTS**. Upon completion of the purpose contemplated for the release of DIAP CMVCI Student Handout, or upon request by DIAP, whichever occurs first, the Host shall immediately return to DIAP all unused DIAP CMVCI Student Handouts received under this Agreement and all copies thereof or, shall immediately destroy all DIAP CMVCI Student Handouts and copies.
- 8. **TERM**. The obligations of the parties to refrain from disclosure of any of the DIAP CMVCI Student Handouts received under this Agreement shall continue in perpetuity.
- 9. **EXPORT CONTROL**. The parties acknowledge that DIAP CMVCI Student Handouts received hereunder may be subject to U. S. export control regulations and hereby agree to comply with such applicable regulations.
